**YOU MUST** contact TD if you have any problems.

**ALL** communication devices are not to be used unless contacting the TD.

**YOU MUST** check-in with the TD either at the 4 pm check-in or via cell phone (613-983-BASS [2277]).

When checking in at the end of the day please **vocalize** your team number instead of holding up fingers.

Make sure you have the appropriate licenses and life jackets.

### NEW PENALTIES

At the AGM it was made abundantly clear that the membership would like to see efforts made to ensure a timely blast at 7:00 am. As a reminder the tournament directors have been empowered to apply penalties that they deem appropriate if they feel a team is unnecessarily delaying the morning procedures either by a late arrival or disorganization. Please arrive early and have your boat promptly ready for boat check.

### STARTING PROCEDURES

Each team will take their boat to the designated **boat check area** where the boat will be checked and recorded by the shore crew. All boats must be checked before they can fish in the tournament. It will be a trickle start by team number. You must wait until your number is called before you leave or begin fishing. Blast off starts promptly at 7:00 a.m. Morning announcements will start at 6:45 am.

### IMPORTANT NOTICE

Competitors **MUST** stop and help any vessel under distress that is the Law! If another competitor is flagging you down please stop and aid them. If you are running in for weigh-in you can stop get their location or take one of them with their fish and bring them back to the weigh-in. Then make tournament staff aware of their location so the vessel in distress can be retrieved.

**Safe return of all teams competing in the tournament is the top priority of the association. Getting your fish to the weigh-in on time is exclusively the angler's responsibility.**

### RULES & REGULATIONS

Anglers are responsible to know the rules, so make sure you review them. Any rule questions or interpretations must be brought to the attention of the Tournament Director Greg Scott or Tom Hooper.

### OFF LIMITS

The docks from Rideau Ferry Harbour are off-limits but anglers still can fish Coutts Bay. Anglers are also reminded of the fish sanctuaries on Big Rideau Lake around Long Island.

### CHECK-IN

Anglers are reminded you **must** check in with the TD at the end of the day, and once checked in teams are no longer to continue fishing even if they check-in well before 4:00 pm. When checking in at the end of the day please **vocalize** your team number instead of holding up fingers.

Our host for this event is Rideau Ferry Harbour. We wish to thank them for allowing us to use their beautiful park and launch facilities. Please use the garbage cans provided to keep the premises clean.

### BIG FISH PRIZES

The big fish payouts are as follows; 1<sup>st</sup> - \$1,020, 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$402 and 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$268. As introduced in 2009, a team can weigh-in multiple big fish. See rules for full details.





## LIFEJACKETS

Lifejackets are to be worn at all times when under power of the outboard motor.

## WEIGH-IN PROCEDURES

**Weigh-in is at 4:00 p.m.** Late penalties apply as per the rules. The block order for the Big Rideau Lake event is **A-B-C-D-E**. When weighing in, you must come into the designated weigh-in area and check in with the Shore Staff. If you have any problems, look for a member of the shore crew to direct you. One member of the team will drop the other member on shore to weigh in fish and pick up the trailer, and then move away from the dock area. Shore staff will help with the directions at the weigh-in area and pass out weigh-in bags.

While waiting to weigh-in in the river, please ensure fresh water is continually pumped into the livewells to maximize fish survival.

**It is imperative to follow ALL DIRECTIONS given by shore staff and the Tournament Director. We need everyone's patience here.**

## OTTAWA RIVER QUALIFIER #3 RESULTS

Clancy Mulvihill and David Craig took top honours in our third qualifier event on the Ottawa River. Bringing to the scales 23.25 lbs which is the largest bag of the season so far. Clancy and Craig also captured 1<sup>st</sup> big fish weighing in a 6.55 giant largie. Great work guys!

## OTTAWA RIVER QUALIFIER #4 RESULTS

Andy Kinstler and David Roy continued their great season and won our third qualifier event on the Ottawa River. Bringing to the scales 20.25 lbs. Andy and David also captured the Ranger Cup as the top placing Ranger. Congratulations guys!

## CLASSIC XVI BODY OF WATER

The body of water for this year's Classic is Lake St. Francis. The top 40 teams after the Big Rideau Lake event will compete for a Ranger 190V rigged with an Evinrude 200 HP E-Tec.

## YOKOHAMA TIRE BIG BASS AWARD

Leading the Yokohama Tire Big Bass Award presented by Goldwing Autocare after 4 qualifiers is Clancy Mulvihill and David Craig with a 6.55 lbs Largemouth caught during qualifier #3 on the Ottawa River. The team weighing in the largest bass of the year through the qualifier events and the Classic will win 2 sets of 4 Yokohama tires from Goldwing Autocare. The prize package will include installation and nitrogen fill by Goldwing Autocare.

## RANGER CUP
