### NEW PENALTIES

At the AGM it was made abundantly clear that the membership would like to see efforts made to ensure a timely blast at 7:00 am. As a reminder the tournament directors have been empowered to apply penalties that they deem appropriate if they feel a team is unnecessarily delaying the morning procedures either by a late arrival or disorganization. Please arrive early and have your boat promptly ready for boat check.

### STARTING PROCEDURES

Each team will take their boat to the designated **boat check area** where the boat will be checked and recorded by the shore crew. All boats must be checked before they can fish in the tournament. It will be a trickle start by team number. You must wait until your number is called before you leave or begin fishing. Blast off starts promptly at 7:00 a.m. Morning announcements will start at 6:45 am.

### IMPORTANT NOTICE

Competitors **MUST** stop and help any vessel under distress that is the Law! If another competitor is flagging you down please stop and aid them. If you are running in for weigh-in you can stop get their location or take one of them with their fish and bring them back to the weigh-in. Then make tournament staff aware of their location so the vessel in distress can be retrieved.

**Safe return of all teams competing in the tournament is the top priority of the association. Getting your fish to the weigh-in on time is exclusively the angler's responsibility.**

### COWLING MARKERS

All teams have received their cowling markers at the first qualifier event and they are to be applied to the boat motor (rectangular one on each side and circle one on the rear) as well as on the trailer (circle one on the drive side of the winch).

### RULES & REGULATIONS

Anglers are responsible to know the rules, so make sure you review them. Any rule questions or interpretations must be brought to the attention of the Tournament Director Greg Scott or Tom Hooper.

### BIG FISH PRIZES

The big fish payouts are as follows; 1<sup>st</sup> - \$1,020, 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$402 and 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$268. As introduced in 2009, a team can weigh-in multiple big fish. See rules for full details.





### CHECK-IN

Anglers are reminded that once you have checked in at the end of the day, teams are no longer to continue fishing even if they check-in well before 4:00 pm.

### WEIGH-IN PROCEDURES

**Weigh-in is at 4:00 p.m.** Late penalties apply as per the rules. The block order for the Dog/Cranberry/Whitefish event is **A-C-D-E-B**. When weighing in, you must come into the designated weigh-in area and check in with the Shore Staff. If you have any problems, look for a member of the shore crew to direct you. One member of the team will drop the other member on shore to weigh in fish and pick up the trailer, and then move away from the dock area. Shore staff will help with the directions at the weigh-in area and pass out weigh-in bags.

While waiting to weigh-in in the bay, please ensure fresh water is continuity pumped into the livewells to maximize fish survival.

**It is imperative to follow ALL DIRECTIONS given by shore staff and the Tournament Director. We need everyone's patience here.**

### ST.LAWRENCE RIVER QUALIFIER #1 RESULTS

Jean Morin and Serge Carriere took top honours in our first qualifier event on the St.Lawrence River. Bringing to the scales 21.30 lbs they won their 2<sup>nd</sup> career Renegade Bass event and \$5,000. Jean and Serge also tied for second big fish on the day with a 5.10 Smallmouth. Congratulations guys.

### RANGER LIVE RELEASE BOAT DEBUT

With the acquisition of assets from Shimano Canada last fall, Renegade Bass was very please to debut out new look stage with full backdrop at the St.Lawrence Qualifier. The second qualifier of the 2011 season sees the debut of the 21 foot Ranger salt water series Live Release Boat powered by two 200 HP Evinrude E-tec outboards. The second LRB will allows us to return to the fish back to lake quicker as well as release them farther from the weigh-in site giving us the mantra "Sooner, Farther, Safer".

### RADIO SHOW

The Renegade Bass Radio Show airs on the Team 1200 from 7 am to 8 am every Saturday morning. Paul Shibata and Jamie Pistilli will cover everything fishing including tournament results and interviews with some of the biggest names in the industry.

### YOKOHAMA TIRE BIG BASS AWARD

Leading the Yokohama Tire Big Bass Award presented by Goldwing Autocare after qualifier #1 is Steve Barnett and Jack Levert with a 5.20 lbs Smallmouth. The team weighing in the largest bass of the year through the qualifier events and the Classic will win 2 sets of 4 Yokohama tires from Goldwing Autocare. The prize package will include installation and nitrogen fill by Goldwing Autocare.

### RANGER CUP

The Ranger Cup program will reward \$500 to the top placing Ranger owner registered for Ranger Cup. When powered by an Evinrude, the owner will receive a \$500 certificate for Evinrude products at Orleans Boat World and Sport. Orleans Boat World and Sport will add an additional \$250 if the Ranger was purchased at Orleans Boat World and Sport.

### G. LOOMIS SKELETON CREW CHALLENGE

A reminder to teams eligible for the G.Loomis Skeleton Crew Challenge, in order to claim the additional \$500 from G.Loomis, you must capture overall big fish honours in the event.

### IMPORTANT NOTICE

It is very important to keep in mind that competitors use courtesy, consideration and respect when fishing docks, boats or in close proximity to cottages. If people are swimming or sitting on the docks do not flip or cast near the docks. Keep a safe distance away and respect the property owners. If possible try striking up a friendly conversation with them, use your judgment on whether they are comfortable with you being close by. If the property owner becomes upset, take the high road, apologize and leave the area immediately. We want to be welcomed back to the lakes and rivers we fish.
